Paralympic Handover

On Wednesday 17th September pupils from eight schools across Devon got together to celebrate the Paralympic Handover in style at the YMCA in Plymouth.

Over 100 pupils took to the 18 rowing machines in a relay to notch up the target of 147,000 metres. The children worked so well that this target was raised to 200,000 metres halfway through the event, and even this higher target was smashed as the final metres rowed totalled 252,000!

Non-disabled & disabled pupils, sports leaders, sports development officers, partnership development managers and representatives from Active Devon, Amateur Rowing Association

(ARA), English Federation Disability Sport (EFDS), Sport England, Team South West and Team Devon all proved that sporting success is achieved when a team works effectively together.

In addition to celebrating the Paralympic Handover of the games, from Beijing to London, the event marked the signing of a Partnership Charter between the ARA and the EFDS. Against a backdrop of students and staff rowing to victory, Rosemary Napp, National Manager of ARA and Colin Chaytors CEO of EFDS signed the agreement (pictured).



Eddystone Challenge 2008

The Eddystone Challenge, organised and run by Mayflower Offshore Rowing Club, is a 28 mile endurance sea rowing event which is open to any rowable craft, provided it is sea worthy and capable of making the round trip from Plymouth out to the notorious Eddystone Reef and back.

This year's event took place on 16th August. Due to the extreme weather the organisers decided in-



stead to use the back up course - a 20 mile row up and back down the River Tamar which separates Devon and Cornwall.

The race had a starting line-up of 37 vessels, including quads, Cornish gigs, kayaks and a ten man whaler, out of which 28 finished the course. Full 2008 results and details of the 2009 event can be found at mayfloweroffshorerowingclub.co.uk/
